Scholarship Fund Policy

The Scholarship Fund of Calvary Church is dedicated to helping young adults fulfill God's purpose on their lives by assisting them financially to attend college. The Scholarship Fund consists of scholarships as follows:

A. Calvary Church Students Scholarships

These scholarships are awarded to Partners and Attendees of Calvary Church who are planning to go to an Assemblies of God College or University. These funds exist to encourage Calvary Church Students to attend Assemblies of God Schools and to enter full-time ministry. One gift is given to encourage attending Assemblies of God Schools and an additional amount is awarded to students entering full-time ministry. The amounts of these scholarships shall be determined annually by the Ministry Council and administered through the Ministry Council and the Church Financial Secretary.

These funds shall be administered as follows:

- 1. Application for Calvary Church Students Scholarships may be made through a "College Scholarship Application" form available at the Hospitality Desk, the Church Office, the church website www.calvarydelran.com, or through the Youth Pastor. These forms must be filled out in their entirety and returned to the Church Office.
- 2. Qualifications for Scholarships.
 - a. Students must have attended Calvary Church for one year prior to application. This is subject to Ministry Council override and the Council itself may suggest giving scholarships to students who have not fulfilled this qualification.
 - b. Students must be planning to attend an Assemblies of God College or University.
 - c. Students requesting the additional ministerial funds must be planning to enter full-time ministry upon graduation and major in Biblical Studies, Pastoral Ministries, Missions or some other related field of ministry endeavor.
- 3. All scholarships are one-time, annual gifts and must be applied for annually in order to receive them. Each request will be evaluated individually based upon each current year's situation. The scholarships will be divided in half and given one semester at a time. Students may apply for new scholarships at the beginning of each new school year.
- 4. Funds will be disbursed to the college or university in the name of the recipient rather than to the recipient personally.
